Letter from Will

Dear Friends

A very Happy Easter to you all. Christ is Risen, Alleluia! It is a wonderful thing to move from the solemn season of Lent to the joy of Easter Day. But like the first disciples we are now in the season when we have to work out what the resurrection of Jesus from the dead means for our lives as individuals and our life together as the Church.

The disciples were absolutely astounded when they met the Risen Jesus and could hardly believe what they were experiencing. They were full of joy, fear, and understandable confusion. The first Christians interpreted what they were experiencing through the lens of what we call the Old Testament and its prophecies concerning the coming Messiah and also through the words of Jesus concerning his death and rising again. So far, so good. But they were still unsure whether the Gospel of Jesus was for the whole world or just for Jews. They were also unsure whether new Gentile (*non-Jewish*) Christians should adopt the practices of their Jewish counterparts.

In our own day we look back with the benefit of hindsight and are deeply grateful that the Gospel was proclaimed to Gentiles as well as Jews and we can work out in our own culture how to express our faith rather than have to adopt the religious practices of first century Judaism, meaningful as they no doubt were to those brought up in that culture.

I believe we are about to see a revolution in how we 'do' Church in the Western world. I believe that God is doing away with a hierarchical, ministercentred model of Church and replacing it with a model that may have us watching a video of a sermon and then discussing it in groups rather than sit in a pew and leave the organisation of worship in the hands of a minister or local preacher.

One of my favourite accounts of meeting the Risen Jesus is found in John Chapter 21. The story begins with a group of disciples who are literally 'hanging around' unsure what to do with themselves now Jesus is no longer with them in bodily form day by day. Peter says, 'Let's go fishing' and in the absence of a better suggestion they all follow him – and catch nothing. It is a symbol of trying to fill a spiritual vacuum with activity and it gets nowhere. But once Jesus turns up everything changes and the disciples start to get used to the idea that while he may not always be physically present as before his Presence will be with them as they continue to obey the command 'Follow me!'

NOTES FROM THE CHURCH COUNCIL

- The North of England District, an amalgamation of Cumbria, Lancashire, Bolton and Rochdale, Manchester and Stockport and Liverpool Districts comes into being on 1st September 2024. The inauguration service will be at Bolton Central on 31st August 2024 at 2.30
- The sale of the Whiteside Way Manse is going through but slowly owing to legal technicalities. Circuit services are held every month on the 1st Sunday at 4pm.
- All Cleveleys Park officers were re elected
- Finance: At 29.2.2024 the balance was £50,806; excepting group and charity money the amount held for church use is £46,078. Collections are down but our room hire is almost completely fully booked. The insurance covered the cost for the replacement windows except payment of excess of £100 for each window. The perspex was covered by donations. We hope the circuit assessment will remain the same. The budget does not look good as energy costs are only fixed to 2025. The cleaner's wage will rise in line with the living wage.
- **Property:** The water supply has been fixed with a new pipe, but we are still trying to get a refund of payments made. Following the demise of the Cleveleys Park Players all the stage equipment and props have been cleared from the storage rooms, and the stage lighting disposed of. A new water boiler in the kitchen, at £536, has now been installed.
- The Safeguarding Policy was renewed and accepted and signed by Rev Will Hunter
- Missions have raised £277.25 to be divided equally between Home and Overseas Missions.
- Rock Kids: A lady from Fleetwood church is helping and Rev Will and Jess give their time once a month.
