Letter from Rev Sarah

Dear Friends,

As we enter the month of February, the month in which many shops will be filled with Valentine cards and gifts, and the month in which Lent begins, I wanted to take a moment to reflect on the theme of love. We all know that Jesus commanded his disciples to love one another, he said that this would be how others would know them as his followers. Of course, this love is not celebrated with hearts, flowers or chocolate, this love can be demanding and challenging. St Paul in his letter to the Ephesians writes "I therefore beg you to lead a life worthy of the calling to which you have been called, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, making every effort to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace." (*Eph 4:1-3*)

As a minister I am often privileged to be invited to know the different things that people are carrying, this knowledge enables me to pray for them and their situation, it also gives me an insight into why they may act or respond in certain ways. However, there many things which we do not know about each other, worries that we carry, fears we need to face, regrets that we cannot resolve, wounds that will not heal. These things are often carried in silence, and yet may have a huge impact on our behaviour, our actions, our responses towards others. Today I wanted to take time to remind us all of the call to bear with one another in love, in humility and gentleness, with patience and grace.

Maybe over this month we might each take a moment to pray for someone else in our fellowship, someone whose situation you know nothing of. I pray that we might all take time to reflect on what it means for us to bear with one another in love, that our fellowship may be stronger, that our welcome may be deeper, that we may each receive the bond of peace.
